Dear Mr. Jordan:

The Rules governing attorney discipline provide, in relevant part, that "[u]pon the request of any person affected by a dismissal, or sua sponte, the chair of the Disciplinary Board or a board member designated by the chair may, at any time, order further investigation of a complaint that has been dismissed by a disciplinary counsel staff attorney." See Rule 17-307(B) NMRA (emphasis added). The Chair of the Disciplinary Board (an agency of the Supreme Court of the State of New Mexico) has designated me, as a member of the Disciplinary Board, to review the above-referenced matter (File No. 412/23) to determine if further investigation is warranted. Please note that my review is narrow and limited in scope – I can order that additional investigation be undertaken if I feel the investigation conducted by Disciplinary Counsel was somehow insufficient, but I do not get to substitute my judgment for that of Disciplinary Counsel when it comes to decisions on the prosecution of complaints.

I have reviewed your original complaint submission, Mr. Williams' response, the Disciplinary Board's investigative file, the Disciplinary Board's August 9, 2023 letter, your subsequent screenshots of Mr. Williams' social media account, and the additional information submitted by you on August 31, 2023, as well as the various linked videos/materials identified by you and Mr. Williams. Under the limited scope of my Rule 17-307(B) review, I find that the investigation conducted was adequate and am not ordering any further investigation of your complaint against Antonio Williams.
