**CITY OF EL PASO, TEXAS'S
ORIGINAL PETITION FOR DECLARATORY RELIEF**

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF THE COURT:

Plaintiff the City of El Paso, Texas (the "City" or "Plaintiff") files this Original Petition seeking a declaratory judgment pursuant to Section 552.324 of Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code (the "Texas Public Information Act" or the "Act").

I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. Plaintiff seeks a declaratory judgment from the Court to allow it to withhold from release documents detailing updates on economic development negotiations between companies and the City of El Paso because the documents are properly excepted from disclosure under Texas Government Code Sections 552.110 and 552.131 (the requested information is the "Closed Session – Economic Development Documents").

2. The Closed Session – Economic Development Documents are PowerPoint presentations, prepared by City of El Paso staff, to facilitate deliberation

regarding economic development negotiations by the City Council for the City of El Paso in closed session, pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 551.087.

3. Accordingly, Plaintiff requests that the Court declare that Plaintiff is relieved from compliance with the Attorney General's Letter Ruling OR2026-024661 (the "Ruling"), and from responding to Requestor Max Grossman's March 20, 2026 public information request (the "Request") because the Closed Session – Economic Development Documents are excepted from disclosure under Texas Government Code Sections 552.110 and 552.131.

II. DISCOVERY

4. Plaintiff does not anticipate a need for discovery in this proceeding. If discovery is necessary, Plaintiff proposes that it be conducted pursuant to the Level 2 procedures of Rule 190 of the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure.

III. PARTIES AND SERVICE

5. Plaintiff the City of El Paso, Texas is a home-rule municipality in El Paso County, Texas. Thus, Plaintiff is subject to the Act pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 552.003(1)(A)(ix).

6. Defendant the Honorable Ken Paxton is the Attorney General of the State of Texas. The Open Records Division of the Office of the Attorney General issued Open Records letter ruling number OR2026-024661. Attorney General Paxton may be served in the Price Daniel, Sr. Building, 209 West 14th Street, Austin, Texas 78701.

7. In accordance with Texas Government Code Section 552.325(b), the undersigned attorney for Plaintiff will notify the requestor, Max Grossman, by certified mail, return receipt requested, of the following:

- a) The existence of the suit, including the subject matter and cause number of the suit and the court in which the suit is filed;
- b) The Requestor's right to intervene in the suit or to choose not to participate in the suit;
- c) The fact that the suit is against the Attorney General; and
- d) The address and phone number of the Office of the Attorney General.

IV. JURISDICTION AND VENUE

8. Venue and jurisdiction are proper in this Court pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 552.324(a).

V. FACTUAL BACKGROUND

9. On March 20, 2026, Max Grossman ("Requestor") submitted a request to the City for records (the "Request"). A true and correct copy of the Request is attached as **Exhibit A**. Requestor asked for a complete list of approved and pending incentive agreements for the period between January 7, 2025 and the present and a list of all corporations that have relocated to El Paso in the period between January 7, 2025 and the present. Plaintiff does not have responsive records to the second portion of this request, relating to a list of all corporations that have relocated to El Paso in the specified timeframe.

10. In accordance with Sections 552.301(b) and 552.301(e) of the Texas Government Code, on April 3, 2026, Plaintiff asked the Attorney General for a

determination as to whether the Closed Session – Economic Development Documents records fell within certain exceptions to the Texas Public Information Act such that those documents could be withheld from disclosure. Plaintiff provided copies of the Closed Session – Economic Development Documents requested and outlined the reasons why the cited exceptions applied. A true and correct copy of Plaintiff's correspondence to the Attorney General, which was also provided to Requestor without copies of the requested documents, is attached hereto as **Exhibit B**.

11. Plaintiff's request for a determination was sent within 10 business days after receipt of the request on April 3, 2026. The City was closed on Tuesday, March 31, 2026 in observance of Community & Labor Heritage Day holiday, meaning that 10 business days after March 20, 2026 was April 6, 2026; Plaintiff filed on the 9th business day of the 10 business day timeframe.

12. Citing Texas Government Code Sections 552.110 and 552.131, Plaintiff took the position that the Closed Session – Economic Development Documents were excepted from disclosure.

13. On June 11, 2026, the Attorney General issued the Ruling, which Plaintiff received on the same date. A true and correct copy of the Ruling is attached as **Exhibit C**. In its Ruling, the Attorney General stated that the Plaintiff could not withhold any portion of the Closed Session – Economic Development Documents under either Section 552.110 or 552.131 of the Texas Government Code. As such, through this lawsuit, City seeks to withhold the Closed Session – Economic Development Documents in their entirety for the reasons stated herein.

VI. CAUSE OF ACTION: DECLARATORY JUDGMENT

14. Plaintiff incorporates by reference paragraphs 1-13 above as if fully pleaded here.

15. Plaintiff requests a declaration authorizing it to withhold the Closed Session – Economic Development Documents. Section 552.110(c) of the Texas Government Code provides that "...commercial or financial information for which it is demonstrated based on specific factual evidence that disclosure would cause substantial competitive harm to the person from whom the information was obtained" is excepted from required public disclosure. The standard for exception employed by Texas courts is the standard expressly included within the statute itself. The City must provide specific factual evidence that the disclosure would cause substantial competitive harm to the City if the information is released.

16. The Closed Session – Economic Development Documents contain commercial and financial information related to the negotiation of various economic development and/or relocation or expansion projects ("City Projects"). As current and future negotiations for other City Projects occur, the release of this information will cause substantial competitive harm to the City because it will reveal the process of how the terms of resulting negotiated agreements are negotiated. Which in turn will ultimately impact the City's ability to negotiate these agreements for future City Projects. For example, if other entities review this information, they are likely demand similar or better terms based upon the terms of the in-process negotiations to the detriment of the City. Additionally, the Closed Session – Economic

Development Documents include information which will likely undermine the individual approach companies undertake in relation to their work; organizational structure; staffing; internal operations; & internal processes pertaining to potential relocation or expansion opportunities involving the City of El Paso.

17. Plaintiff requests a declaration authorizing it to withhold the Closed Session – Economic Development Documents that responsive to the Request. The City is also requesting a determination pursuant to Section 552.131 of the Government Code that the City of El Paso is excepted from disclosure regarding certain information relating to “economic development negotiations involving a government body and a business prospect that the governmental body seeks to have locate, stay, or expand” within or near the governmental body. This section excepts from disclosures trade secrets and commercial or financial information whose release would cause substantial competitive harm to the business. Tex. Gov’t Code § 552.131(a). In order to show that commercial or financial information is privileged, a business must make a specific actual or evidentiary showing that the release will cause competitive harm. Open Records Decision No. 661. Also, until an agreement is entered into, information regarding the economic incentives being offered to a business and the details regarding the proposed incentives are excepted. Tex Gov’t Code § 552.131(b)-(c). Those agreements are ultimately public documents as they are posted as part of City Council Meeting agendas for consideration and discussion – in public – by the City Council for the City of El Paso. Disclosing information relevant to negotiations which may result in an agreement would cause the City substantial

harm in that companies interested in participating in economic development negotiations with the City to remain, expand or relocate to/in El Paso would be hesitant - if not completely averse - to sharing trade secret, commercial or financial information pertinent to facilitating negotiations between the companies and the City of El Paso as doing so would expose their confidential information to the market and competitors at large.

18. Plaintiff is constantly in the process of economic development negotiations. The information contained in the documents includes information which contains trade secret methodologies including details regarding the incentives the City is considering, and other details regarding projects and regarding the companies about whom the documents discuss. The City has taken steps to maintain the confidentiality and limited release of the information provided and analysis pertinent thereto via presenting the negotiations to the City Council of the City of El Paso in closed session, as allowed by Texas Government Code Section 551.087. The Closed Session – Economic Development Documents were prepared to be presented in closed session to allow the City Council of the City of El Paso to discuss or deliberate regarding commercial or financial information that the City Council of the City of El Paso has received from a business prospect that the City Council of the City of El Paso seeks to have locate, stay, or expand in El Paso and with which the City Council is conducting economic development negotiations or to deliberate the offer of a financial or other incentive to a business prospect. Plaintiff believes that the release of the Closed Session – Economic Development Documents, which includes

commercial information and other details regarding the projects, will hurt the City's negotiating position which the City is actively considering and may consider in future economic incentives to the companies, and as such, this information should be excepted from disclosure to the extent that such information has not already been provided to the public. See Tex Gov't Code § 552.131(b)-(c).

VII. PRAYER

19. For the above reasons, Plaintiff the City of El Paso, Texas prays:
- a) That the Court declare that Plaintiff is relieved from compliance with the Attorney General's Letter Ruling OR2026-024661, and from responding to Requestor Max Grossman's March 20, 2026 public information request because the requested information is excepted from disclosure under Texas Government Code Sections 552.110 and 552.131.
 - b) For any and all other relief to which it may be justly entitled.

Dear Attorney General Paxton:

I am writing this letter pursuant to Section 552.301 of the Texas Government Code to seek your opinion concerning whether certain requested information is exempted from release.

On March 20, 2026, Max Grossman submitted a request for records for the following:

"Please provide me with a complete list of approved and pending incentive agreements to lure companies to El Paso for the period between January 7, 2025 and the present.

Please also provide me with a list of all corporations that have relocated to El Paso from elsewhere in the period between January 7, 2025 and the present."

A copy of the request is attached as **Exhibit A**. While certain City of El Paso (City) departments operate twenty-four hours a day due to operational necessity, under City Policy, all departments are required to operate a minimum of Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Open records requests for the City are processed through the Office of the City Attorney. Accordingly, City business hours and business days for purposes of calculating the deadlines specified in the Public Information Act are based on the Office of the City Attorney's schedule, which has regular business hours Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Additionally, the City was closed on Tuesday, March 31, 2026 in observance of the Community & Labor Heritage Day holiday. Subsequent to the date of receipt, the following have been business days for the City of El Paso: March 23, 24, 25, 27, and 30, and April 1, 2, and 3, 2026.

The City believes that the records enclosed as **Exhibits B-1, B-2, and B-3** must be withheld pursuant to the following sections of the Texas Government Code:

Texas Government Code §552.110: Confidentiality of Trade Secrets; Confidentiality of Certain Commercial or Financial Information:

Section 552.110 (c) of the Act provides that "...commercial or financial information for which it is demonstrated based on specific factual evidence that disclosure would cause substantial competitive harm to the person from whom the information was obtained" is excepted from required public disclosure. The standard for exception by employed by Texas courts is the standard expressly included within the statute itself. The City must provide specific factual evidence that the disclosure would cause substantial competitive harm to the City if the information is released.

Exhibits B-1, B-2, and B-3 includes commercial and financial information related to the negotiation of various economic development and/or relocation or expansion projects (City Projects). As current and future negotiations for other City Projects occur, the release of this information would cause substantial competitive harm to the City because it would reveal the process of how the terms of resulting negotiated agreements, when applicable, which in turn may ultimately impact the City's ability to negotiate these agreements for future City Projects. For example, if other entities reviewed this information, they may demand terms based upon the terms of the in-process negotiations to the detriment of the City.

The City therefore requests that this information be excepted from disclosure in its entirety under Section 552.110 of the Act.

Section 552.131 Confidentiality of Certain Economic Development Information

Additionally or in the alternative; the City is also requesting a determination pursuant to Section 552.131 of the Government Code that the City of El Paso is excepted from disclosure regarding certain information relating to "economic development negotiations involving a government body and a business prospect that the governmental body seeks to have locate, stay, or expand" within or near the governmental body. This section excepts from disclosures trade secrets and commercial or financial information whose release would cause substantial competitive harm to the business. Tex. Gov't Code § 552.131(a). In order to show that commercial or financial information is privileged, a business must make a specific actual or evidentiary showing that the release will cause competitive harm. Open Records Decision No. 661. Also, until an agreement is entered into, information regarding the economic incentives being offered to the business the details regarding the proposed incentives are excepted. Tex Gov't Code § 552.131(b)-(c).

Dear Mr. Gonzalez:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 26-016864 (Ref. No. 26-TPIA-994).

The City of El Paso (the "city") received a request for information pertaining to specified incentive agreements and corporations. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under sections 552.110 and 552.131 of the Government Code. We have considered the exceptions you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.110 of the Government Code protects (1) trade secrets, and (2) commercial or financial information the disclosure of which would cause substantial competitive harm to the person from whom the information was obtained. *See* Gov't Code § 552.110(b)-(c). Although the city argues the submitted information is excepted under section 552.110, that exception is designed to protect the interests of third parties, not the interests of a governmental body. Thus, we do not address the city's argument under section 552.110.

Section 552.131 of the Government Code relates to economic development information and provides in part:

(a) Information is excepted from [required public disclosure] if the information relates to economic development negotiations involving a governmental body and a business prospect that the governmental body seeks to have locate, stay, or expand in or near the territory of the governmental body and the information relates to:

(1) a trade secret of the business prospect; or

(2) commercial or financial information for which it is demonstrated based on specific factual evidence that disclosure would cause substantial competitive harm to the person from whom the information was obtained.

(b) Unless and until an agreement is made with the business prospect, information about a financial or other incentive being offered to the business prospect by the governmental body or by another person is excepted from [required public disclosure].

Id. § 552.131(a)-(b). Section 552.131(a) excepts from disclosure only “trade secret[s] of [a] business prospect” and “commercial or financial information for which it is demonstrated based on specific factual evidence that disclosure would cause substantial competitive harm to the person from whom the information was obtained.” *Id.* § 552.131(a). Section 552.131(a) protects the proprietary interest of third parties that have provided information to governmental bodies, not the interests of the government bodies themselves. Thus, we do not address the city’s claim under section 552.131(a) for the information at issue.

Section 552.131(b) protects information about a financial or other incentive that is being offered to a business prospect by a governmental body or another person. *See id.* § 552.131(b). Section 552.131(b) protects the interests of governmental bodies, not third parties. Upon review, we find you have not demonstrated any portion of the submitted information reveals financial or other incentives that are being offered to a business prospect by the city. Thus, we conclude the city may not withhold any portion of the submitted information under section 552.131(b) of the Government Code. As no other exceptions to disclosure have been raised, the city must release the submitted information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
